ENGINEERS CANADA CONDEMNS ONTARIO GOVERNMENT REVERSAL ON REPEAL

As reported in last week's GLP Weekly, the Ontario Government has removed the planned proclamation date of the repeal of Section 12.(3)(a) of the Professional Engineers Act.

Engineers Canada has issued a media release condemning the Ontario government's decision.

The National regulatory body cited the missed opportunity to improve worker safety and national standardization as particularly concerning.

Engineers Canada, Manager of Government Relations, **Alana Lavoie** was featured prominently in the June 17th Queen's Park Briefing, a daily publication of the Toronto Star, as well as a June 18th article in Canadian Consulting Engineer (CCE), speaking against the decision stating, "There's no reason why a worker in Ontario shouldn't be as safe as a worker in any other province in Canada."

The proclamation date was scheduled for September 1, 2013 prior to the Government's new decision. PEO continues to support a proclamation date as soon as possible.

Cabinet decision will put workers in danger, engineers say

Engineers in Ontario and Canada are condemning a move by the Liberal government to backtrack on a 2010 law that would have required industry to hire certified engineers for any substantial change in their machinery.

According to the national body representing professional engineering associations, the province's reversal could put worker safety at risk.

"There's no reason why a worker in Ontario shouldn't be as safe as a worker in any other province in Canada," says Alana Lavoie, manager of government relations at Engineers Canada, the national organization of provincial and territorial professional associations of engineers.

Ontario is currently the only province that does not require a licensed engineer to oversee changes to machinery or equipment in some conditions, spelled out in [section 12\(3\)\(a\) of the Professional Engineers Act](#). The industrial exception was introduced to Ontario in 1984.

Under the *Open For Business Act* passed by the legislature in 2010, the industrial exception was supposed to be repealed by proclamation at a time of the government's choosing. At a meeting of cabinet on June 12, the government decided not to proclaim the repeal and leave the current industrial exception in place.

PC Party critic for small business and red tape Todd Smith raised the industrial exception [in question period on May 28](#), urging the government not to repeal the exception saying that it is already too expensive to do business in Ontario.

"This government, with the help of their NDP farm team, is killing manufacturing across Ontario. A Trenton VP of a manufacturing facility wrote you and me, minister, saying that currently they estimate the cost of doing business in Ontario is 30% higher than the rest of Canada," Smith told Attorney General John Gerretsen.

"Manufacturers need room to innovate. They need less red tape, not more."

Earlier this spring, representatives of the Professional Engineers of Ontario told *QP Briefing* [it was "shocking"](#) that Ontario was keeping a lower standard than other provinces.

Lavoie said analysis of public workplace safety data shows that manufacturing workers in Ontario show a higher per capita injury and fatality rate than other provinces. Engineers Canada estimates in a fact sheet on the industrial exception that the costs of worker injury in Ontario are three to ten times the potential regulatory costs to industry.

Ian Howcroft, vice-president of the Canadian Manufacturers and Exporters (CME) for Ontario, strongly opposed the repeal of the industrial exception, arguing that PEO used misleading data to argue that manufacturing was more dangerous than it actually is in Ontario—and that, in any case, repeal of the industrial exception wouldn't prevent the injuries that are actually occurring.

“When you look at the injuries recorded by the WSIB, some of them are traffic accidents, some of them are falls, and some of them are from people not following proper lockdown policies,” says Howcroft. According to Howcroft, the repeal or not of the industrial exception was immaterial to these injuries.

The cabinet decision not to proclaim the repeal leaves Ontario alone among Canada’s provinces, but Howcroft says similar provisions exist in the industrial American states that Ontario competes with.

Engineers Canada’s Lavoie says that another problem with cabinet’s decision to punt on the repeal is the missed opportunity to harmonize national standards. Howcroft disputes this, saying that it hasn’t been an issue since 1984 when the exception was brought in.

“It just seems like every time they turn around there’s some other new regulation that they have to deal with that’s potentially costing them more money, more time and possibly costing us more jobs.”

PEO WRAPS UP MONTHS OF MEETINGS WITH MANUFACTURERS

PEO Enforcement Officer and Lead on the Repeal **Marisa Sterling**, P.Eng., wrapped up her second Ontario tour to inform manufacturers of the repeal of section 12.(3)(a) of the *Professional Engineers Act* that was scheduled to take effect September 1st, 2013 and has now been delayed.

Both provincial tours delivered information sessions and audits of businesses during a three year period, to assist with the interpretation of what types of professional engineering work will soon require licence oversight to improve worker safety.

Ms. Sterling's final sessions were June 19th in Toronto.

PEO accomplished the following work during the past three year transition period as provided by Ms. Sterling:

- Educated close to 1,500 people who work in manufacturing across Ontario on the definition of professional engineering work, the availability of a limited licence for technologists to practice and the protected title of “engineer”.
- Created the online “Take this Test” explanation of professional engineering work.
- Created online webinars explaining the P.Eng. and limited licences, their requirements and how to apply.
- Worked with over 900 manufacturers to clarify the narrow scope of the “industrial exception”.
- Developed an on-line platform for communications with industry including the website www.engineeringinontario.ca and the email address consultwithus@peo.on.ca
- Developed collaborative working relationships with manufacturing associations, such as the Excellence in Manufacturing Consortium (EMC), local Manufacturing Associations in Northumberland and Quinte, regional Ministry of Economic Development Trade and Employment officials, local Chambers of Commerce and Municipal economic development offices.
- Created a Compliance Tool Kit and helped over 325 manufacturing companies conduct compliance audits – from micro-sized to large-sized businesses and across all manufacturing sectors.
- Conducted over 25 site visits of businesses to help audit their engineering operations.
- Confirmed compliance to the repeal by 269 businesses (83 per cent of audited companies) who either had sufficient licence holders on staff, were outsourcing their engineering work or are make staffing adjustments before September 1, 2013.
- Waived the licence application fees for employees of 56 companies (17 per cent of audited companies) from small- to large-sized businesses and across all manufacturing sectors, and provided them one additional year to September 1, 2014 to implement their compliance plans.

PEO will continue its commitment to improving worker safety by September 1, 2013 and believes that any further delay in the repeal is a mistake and will put workers at risk.
