THE S.E. WOLFE THESIS AWARD

The S.E. Wolfe Thesis Award is given annually to a member who has passed at least one examination and whose thesis has been awarded the highest mark of all those presented during the year.

Abner Ocampo, P.Eng., receives the 2017 S.E. Wolfe Thesis Award for his engineer report *Rehabilitation and Design Improvement of Moveable Bridge Buffers and Span Locks*. He received a mark of 99 per cent.

The award recognizes Professor S.E. Wolfe, P.Eng., a past member of the former Board of Examiners (now the Academic Requirements Committee).

THE V.G. SMITH AWARD

Given annually to a professional engineer licensed during the year through the association's technical examination program who attained the highest mark in any three technical examination papers, excluding the Complementary Studies and Professional Practice examinations.

Lawrence William Green, P.Eng., receives the 2017 V.G. Smith Award. Lawrence successfully completed 10 technical exams with an average of 84 per cent. His three highest scores were 97 per cent, 96 per cent and 93 per cent.
