## PROGRESSIVE CONSERVATIVES WIN MAJORITY IN ONTARIO ELECTION

The Progressive Conservatives have won a majority government in Thursday's Ontario election. Party Leader **Doug Ford** will remain Premier for at least another four years.

The New Democratic Party will remain the official opposition. The Ontario Liberal Party failed to gain official party status. Both party leaders, **Andrea Horwath** and **Steven Del Duca**, respectively, have announced their resignation.

# ENGINEER ELECTED AS MPP OF WINDSOR-TECUMSEH

Former PEO Government Liaison Committee member **Andrew Dowie**, P.Eng., has won a seat as MPP for the riding of Windsor-Tecumseh. He won 45.9 per cent of the vote.

Mr. Dowie was a founding member of PEO's Government Liaison Committee and is a former GLP Chair of the PEO Windsor-Essex chapter. He also served as Councillor for the Town of Tecumseh since 2014.

During his campaign, he won the endorsement of both local Mayors and six unions. Premier **Doug Ford** made multiple trips to Windsor to support Mr. Dowie.

Mr. Dowie's election to the Legislature is timely, following the retirement of the only engineer in the previous Legislature, **Jim McDonell**, P.Eng.

In the past, PEO has pursued a goal to have engineers elected. For example, in 2011, PEO set a goal of having 11 engineers elected in that election. That was an excellent year for engineers running as there were 11 candidates from five different parties, and three were elected.

It is beneficial to have a professional engineer in the Legislature who understands engineering issues and regulatory impacts to our profession, and can apply an analytical approach to making decisions. In addition to Mr. McDonell, others were:

- **Phil McNeely** - elected for the Liberals in the riding of Ottawa-Orleans.
- **Jack MacLaren** - elected for the Progressive Conservatives in the riding of Carleton-Mississippi Mills.

Previously, **Norm Sterling**, P.Eng., was an MPP representing several ridings from 1977 to 2011.

# 2022 PROVINCIAL ELECTION OVERVIEW

The PC Party has secured power for another four years with **Doug Ford** as Premier. The New Democratic Party has remained the official opposition, and the Liberal Party has failed to gain official party status. Both parties' leaders, **Andrea Horwath** and **Steven Del Duca**, respectively, have announced their resignation. The Green Party has maintained its previously held seat.

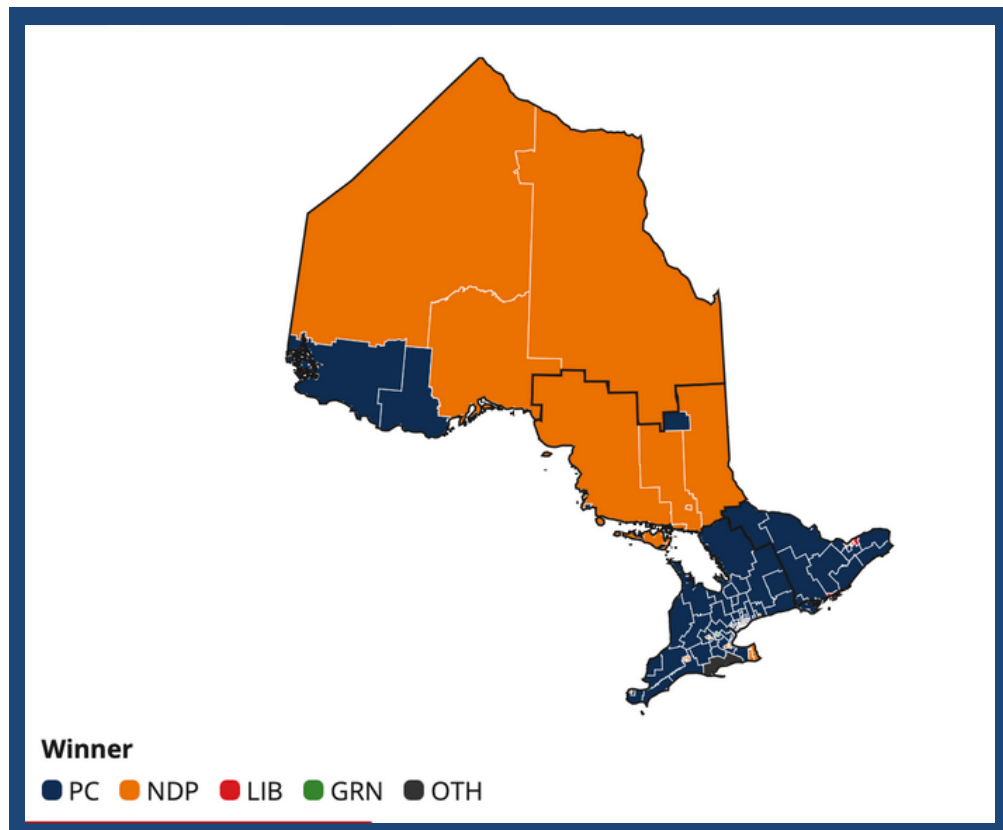
