PARTY LEADERS ENGAGE IN SECOND PROVINCIAL ELECTION DEBATE

The provincial party leaders kicked off another busy week on the campaign trail as they took each other on with the second Ontario election debate. It was moderated by **Steve Paikin** of TVO and **Althia Raj** from the *Toronto Star*.

Mr. Paikin is a former recipient of the PEO President's Medal. On March 1, he moderated a panel to kick off National Engineering Month with then PEO President **Christian Bellini**, P.Eng and other Canadian Engineering leaders.

The day also coincided with Professional Engineers Day, which was first declared by the province of Ontario in 2018. It was the first time that a profession was given a day named in its honour.

The four main party leaders are:

- Andrea Horwath NDP
- Steven Del Duca Liberal
- Mike Schreiner Green

FORMER ONTARIO PREMIER RETIRES

The retirement party for former Ontario Premier **Kathleen Wynne** was held at the Leaside Memorial Community Gardens in Toronto on May 14.

Ms. Wynne was a longtime supporter of PEO who often participated in East Toronto Chapter events. Most recently, she was featured at the chapter's AGM in Feb 2022 where she spoke about the importance of PEO's government liaison activities.

She was also interviewed by PEO past-president **Marisa Sterling**, P.Eng. for the December 2020 issue of the *GLP Weekly Times*. The two discussed the significance of women in the engineering profession, the anniversary of the Montreal Massacre, and PEO's 30 by 30 initiative.

Ms. Wynne's active interest in GLP activities has been important, as having an MPP advocate who understands PEO's goals is beneficial.

Ms. Wynne made Canadian history as not only the first female Premier of Ontario, but also the first openly gay Premier in Canada. She served as the Leader of the Ontario Liberal Party and Premier from 2013 to 2018. She has held her seat in the Legislature until now.

She was first elected to the Legislature in the 2003 general election as a member of the Liberal party.

Prior to her election to the Legislature, Ms. Wynne worked extensively in the education field. She was employed as a tutor, as an English as a second language teacher, and also as a mediator, where she implemented conflict resolution programs in over 60 Ontario schools in the 1990s. She also served as president of the Toronto Institute of Human Relations.

FORMER PEO COUNCILLOR ELECTED TO OSPE BOARD





Former PEO Councillor Dr. **Sandra Ausma**, P.Eng. (left) has been elected to the OSPE Board of Directors and Dr. **Marilyn Powers**, P.Eng., has been elected as OSPE President and Chair of the Board.

Ontario Society of Professional Engineers (OSPE) held its Annual General Meeting virtually on May 9, where they announced the results of the Board of Directors election. The new OSPE President and Board Chair is Dr. **Marilyn Powers**, P.Eng. She is also currently the Director of Academic Technology Integration & Innovation at Mohawk College. Dr. Powers holds a Ph.D. and a Master's degree in Biomedical Engineering from the University of Calgary, and earned her undergraduate degree in Mechanical Engineering from University of Waterloo.

Also elected to the board was former PEO Councillor Dr. **Sandra Ausma**, P.Eng. Dr. Ausma served as a PEO Councillor for the Northern Region and an Executive member of PEO Sudbury Chapter from 2012 to 2014, as PEO Vice President from 2013 to 2014, and Councillor-at-Large from 2019 to 2021. She holds a Ph.D. in Land Resource Science and a Master's in Biological Engineering from University of Guelph, and earned her Bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering from University of Waterloo.

In her candidate statement, Dr. Ausma spoke about the importance of teamwork between the regulators, saying: "I strongly believe that OSPE and PEO need to face the future arm-in-arm, united as we overcome future challenges to the profession."

OSPE and PEO have co-sponsored a number of initiatives including the Government Liaison Annual Conferences of 2011, 2016, and 2018.

Current GLC members include Mr. Lee, **Asif Khan**, P.Eng. from Windsor-Essex Chapter and **Tracy Garner**, P.Eng. from East Toronto Chapter, both representing GLP reps, **Alex Weryha**, P.Eng., representing EITs, and **Shawn Yanni** representing students.

The Government Liaison Committee was set up in 2011 as an oversight body for the program period. Currently, there are 124 representatives for each of the 124 ridings. In the past few months, GLP reps have met with a number of Ministers and MPPs, and look forward to continuing their goal to ensure every MPP understands PEO's responsibility as the regulator of professional engineering in Ontario in the public interest.

It is important for GLP reps to stay informed on what is happening with MPPs so that they can communicate with them on PEO's mandate.
