

PEO CELEBRATES ITS 100TH ANNIVERSARY

Tuesday, June 14th marked the 100th anniversary since PEO was founded in 1922.

PEO President **Nick Colucci**, P.Eng., sent out a celebratory message to licence holders, saying, "This is a remarkable accomplishment for a regulator and is something for which every licence and certificate holder should be proud."

NDP SET TO APPOINT TORONTO MPP AS INTERIM LEADER

Following the resignation of Ontario New Democratic Party Leader, **Andrea Horwath**, and Ontario Liberal Party Leader, **Steven Del Duca**, both parties have been considering who among their ranks will be appointed the interim leaders.

Peter Tabuns, MPP (Toronto— Danforth) is the expected front-runner for interim leader of the Ontario New Democratic Party.

He was first elected to the Legislature in a 2006 by-election, at which time he served as Critic for Environment, Citizenship and Immigration, Transportation, and Public Infrastructure Renewal. More recently, in the 42nd Parliament, MPP Tabuns held the position of Energy and Climate Crisis Critic.



Peter Tabuns, MPP (Toronto—Danforth) is being considered for the Ontario NDP's interim leader.

Prior to his election, MPP Tabuns served as Executive Director of Greenpeace from 1999 to 2004, and was a Councillor for the City of Toronto from 1990 to 1997.

In 2009, he ran for leadership of the Ontario NDP against **Andrea Horwath**, gaining 40 per cent of the vote.

According to reports, other MPPs being considered for the position of NDP interim leader are **Peggy Sattler**. MPP (London West), **Bhutila Karpoche**, MPP (Parkdale-High Park), and **Jennifer French**, MPP (Oshawa). The party is expected to make their decision on June 28th.

Thus far, no one has been announced for consideration as the interim leader of the Ontario Liberal Party.

ENGINEERS CANADA APPOINTS NEW PRESIDENT

Engineers Canada has appointed **Kathy Baig**, ing., as the new President for the 2022-2023 term.

Ms. Baig has been President of the Ordre des ingénieurs du Québec since 2016. She has also been on the Board of Directors of Via Rail Canada since 2017.

She has worked as a process manager, project manager, and quality coordinator for companies like IBM, Johnson & Johnson, and Aéroports de Montréal.

She earned her bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering from Polytechnique Montréal in 2004, and later earned a specialized graduate degree and an MBA from HEC Montréal.

In addition to her earned degrees from
Polytechnique Montréal and HEC
Montréal, Ms. Baig has also been
awarded an honourary degree from the École de technologie supérieure.

Kathy Baig, ing., has been appointed as the new President of Engineers Canada.

Additionally, she has been awarded the Mercury Award by the Federation of Chambers of Commerce of Québec for her accomplishments as a leader, has been named a Fellow by Engineers Canada and the Canadian Academy of Engineering, and was a recipient of Canada's Top 40 under 40 Award in 2019.

This week, the *GLP Weekly Times* features two of the newly elected Ontario MPPs, **George Pirie**, MPP (Timmins) and **Chandra Pasma**, MPP (Ottawa West-Nepean) so PEO licence holders can get to know their Members of Provincial Parliament. Ministerial positions are expected to be announced in the coming weeks.

GEORGE PIRIE, MPP



George Pirie, MPP (Timmins)

George Pirie is the newly elected MPP for the riding of Timmins. He represents the Progressive Conservative party.

MPP Pirie won his seat in a surprising upset against longtime NDP MPP **Gilles Bisson**, who had held the riding since 1990.

Prior to his election to the Legislature, MPP Pirie served as the Mayor of Timmins since 2018. He has also served as Chair of Cochrane District Social Services Administration Board, Northern College Board of Governors and as President and CEO of Place Dome Canada

He has sat on a number of his local boards and committees, including:

- Timmins Audit Committee,
- Source Water Protection Committee,
- Municipal Accommodation Tax Committee,
- the Board of Timmins Economic Development Corporation,
- Timmins Police Services Board.

CHANDRA PASMA, MPP

Chandra Pasma is the newly elected MPP for the riding of Ottawa West-Nepean. She represents the New Democratic Party.

She defeated Progressive Conservative incumbent **Jeremy Roberts**, with over 37 per cent of the vote.

She previously challenged Mr. Roberts in 2018 and lost in a tight race, garnering 32.5 per cent of the vote compared to his 32.8 per cent.



Chandra Pasma, MPP (Ottawa West-Nepean)

Prior to her election, MPP Pasma has worked as a researcher for the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE). Previously, she served as a policy advisor at the Office of the Leader of the Federal NDP.

MPP Pasma is also a mother of three.


Mr. Colucci went on to highlight the importance of PEO's


