RED TAPE MINISTRY LEGISLATION LOOKS TO AMEND PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS ACT

Minister of Red Tape Reduction **Parm Gill**, MPP (Milton) tabled Bill 139, Less Red Tape, More Common Sense Act on October 19th.

The Bill, if passed in its current form, would look to make several changes to the *Professional Engineers Act* that are consistent with PEO's existing mandate

PEAK UPDATE PROVIDED TO LICENCE HOLDERS

With the enforcement of the Practice Evaluation and Knowledge (PEAK) program beginning in 2024, PEO has continued to distribute information on the outline of the new requirements for professional engineers.

Released earlier this month, the most recent update provides an overview of the continuing professional development (CPD) requirement for professional engineers and limited licence holders, as mandated by the *Professional Engineers Act*.

The CPD requirement, which is administered through the PEAK program, will include potential administrative suspensions for non-compliance, as well as an audit program. The program will include enhancements in 2024, such as a PEAK exemption for fee remission enrollees and expanded CPD admissibility criteria.

The PEAK program user interface has also been improved. Additionally, the licence status terminology in the PEO directory of practitioners will be updated to better reflect eligibility to practice professional engineering.

During the call, representatives will discuss the November 18th GLP training summit, the annual feedback report, the progress on mandatory professional development, and other PEO updates.



FALL EDITION OF ENGINEERING DIMENSIONS PREPARES MEMBERS FOR NEW REQUIREMENTS



With less than three months before changes to professional licensure are brought into effect, the Fall edition of *Engineering Dimensions* outlines what they will mean for Ontario's professional engineers.

"PEO cannot remain stagnant," said PEO President **Roydon Fraser**, P.Eng., in his quarterly message. "[A]s we enter the Fifth Industrial Revolution and technology continues to advance, PEO is working to meet the challenges that will emerge to continue to serve and protect the public interest."

This issue also outlines the introduction of a Recognized Programs List for academic degrees obtained outside Canada, a standardized technical exam program for international candidates and a competency-based assessment model for evaluating candidates' experience.
