He currently serves as the Liberal Critic for Health, Northern Development, Indigenous Affairs, and Colleges and Universities.

During his speech to attendees at the licensing event, President-Elect Wowchuk congratulated all recipients, and explained the purpose of a professional engineering licence. The following is an excerpt from his speech:

"The great truth is that licensure is not a burden, it is *value added*. It enhances your résumé. It tells employers that you possess top-notch educational credentials, have competence coming from years of work experience, and are ethical and of

good character. It also reminds *you* that you have a solemn duty to be competent, hardworking, and ethical. By becoming a P.Eng., you also have established a sort of fraternal connection with your peers."

President-Elect Wowchuk would go on to encourage professional engineers to become more involved in the political process, citing the value of the profession as "the world's problem solvers."

"Engineers enjoy high levels of public esteem and character. I think more of us should step forward to serve our country, our province, our city -- and our profession."

PEO YORK CHAPTER MEETS WITH MINISTER OF LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS TO DISCUSS LICENSURE

STOUFFVILLE - Legislative Affairs Minister **Paul Calandra**, MPP (Markham-Stouffville) met with new GLP Representative **Michael Chiu, P.Eng.**, on November 17 at his constituency office in Stouffville. Also attending the meeting was PEO York Chapter GLP Chair **Reza Mahmoudipour, P.Eng.** Minister Calandra also serves as the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing and the Government House Leader.

Minister Calandra was first elected in 2018, and did an exclusive interview with the PEO *GLP Weekly Times* in August of 2021 where he shared his thoughts

on the role that PEO plays in regulating and advancing the practice of engineering to protect the public interest.

PEO York Chapter has responsibility for nine ridings, including those held by the President of the Treasury Board, and the Ministers of Education, Transportation, Francophone Affairs, Mental Health and Addictions, and Children, Community and Social Services.

ONTARIO MAN ORDERED TO REFRAIN FROM REPRESENTING HIMSELF AS A P.ENG.



The following is taken from a release issued by Professional Engineers Ontario

The Ontario Superior Court of Justice in Toronto has prohibited a Toronto man, **Michael Stephen Archer**, from engaging in the practice of professional engineering, using the titles of "Professional Engineer" and "P.Eng." as an occupational or business designation, and making or using an engineering seal, without an engineering licence.

In 2022 and 2023, Mr. Archer, who is not a professional engineer, repeatedly used the title of "P.Eng." as an occupational designation. He additionally threatened to practice professional engineering, to provide to the public services within the practice of professional engineering, and to make and use an engineer's seal without being licensed, contrary to the *Professional Engineers Act.*

PEO sought the order in the interest of public safety, and The Court ordered Mr. Archer to pay costs of \$25,000 to PEO.

PEO reminds the public that the unauthorized use or forgery of a professional engineer's seal on construction or design drawings is a quasi-criminal offence under the *Professional Engineers Act.* Such conduct may also result in criminal charges under the Criminal Code of Canada.

Professional Engineers Ontario administers the *Professional Engineers Act* to serve and protect the public interest by licensing Ontario's 85,000 individual practitioners and engineering firms. Professional engineers can be identified by the P.Eng. after their names.

When retaining the services of an engineer or engineering firm, the public may search the directories of licensed professional engineers and authorized professional engineering companies at <u>https://peo.on.ca/directory</u>.
