My passion to help recently includes the PIPSC federal government NR engineers. December 14th, 2023 I was thanked for being the catalyst that successfully negotiated a collective agreement with Treasury Board of Canada. Eastern region. Federal government engineers **“Your vote will make a difference”**.

Our challenge is to understand the proposed governance changes, which could reduce licensing to a narrow definition of regulated engineering.

It's difficult to understand how members motions and simple consultation with members has not been included in critical governance decisions.

The loss of member and volunteer influence inside PEO continues. Unlike my opponent, my record shows I have asked the important questions and defended self-governance and self-regulation.

My opponent was Chair of RPLC and brought the new admissions models to Council in November 2022. It is valuable to note that NO stakeholders were sought by RPLC on the new admissions model despite requests: (1) not Engineers Canada, (2) not CEAB, (3) not universities [despite creating (i) BTech issues, (ii) Masters'/PhD issues, (iii) an inability for those in emerging disciplines (e.g., AI, autonomous vehicles) from science and math to now obtain an P.Eng, (iv) accreditation issues, and (v) licensing issues such that universities now recommend to professors to seek their P.Eng. license in another province), (4) not OACETT, (5) not OSPE, (6) not Chapters, (7) not other Engineering Regulators such as Alberta and NB who have similar fairness legislation but adopted less disruptive admission models.

My actions on Council in support of **A PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION, RUN BY PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS** is proven by my Council voting record.
