Mr. Gupta informed Minister Cho of PEO's initiatives to align its licensing process with the *Fair Access to Regulated Professions and Compulsory Trades Act* (FARPACTA), including eliminating the requirement for 12 months of Canadian work experience.

Minister Cho has participated in several other PEO Scarborough Chapter events, most recently providing video greetings to the Chapter's 19th Annual Bridge Building Competition in April.
