Northern Region Congress

Each year PEO holds a Northern Region Congress (NRC) in February, June, and September to foster connection and information flow between PEO membership and PEO Council and Staff.

The Algoma Chapter hosted the June 2016 NRC at the Delta Waterfront Hotel in Sault Ste. Marie. Delegates from throughout northern Ontario attended including chapter representatives from Algoma, Lakehead, North Bay, Porcupine/Kapuskasing, and Sudbury as well as the Northern Regional Councilors. The Regional Councilor Committee (RCC) Chair, PEO Chapter Manager, and Chapter Coordinator also attended. During the NRC chapter activities were presented; regional concerns and chapter finances were discussed; and upcoming events, activities, and programs were reviewed.

To kick off the NRC, a social event was held at the Canadian Bushplane Heritage Centre including refreshments, music, and a tour of Northern Superior Brewery, located at the site. A general invitation was forwarded to all PEO Algoma Chapter members to attend the event. A coach tour of Lake Superior's North Shore was organized for the delegates following the NRC.

PEO Updates

Repeal of the Industrial Exception

On November 26, 2016, the Ontario government announced its intention to permanently abandon its commitment to repeal subsection 12(3)(a) the Professional Engineers Act, the so-called industrial exception. Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) expresses in the strongest possible terms its objection government's the decision and reconsideration. Subsection 12(3)(a) currently allows non-engineers to carry out acts of professional engineering on equipment or machinery used to produce products for their employers in their employer's facility.

PEO has been working with the Ministry of Labour, undertaking research into recent prosecutions under the Occupational Health and Safety Act involving injuries to employees in manufacturing environments. A report on this research is expected to be finalized by early 2016. Through its outreach to industry, PEO believes only seven per cent of manufacturing employers are likely to be affected by the repeal, which would have been implemented without any expense to taxpayers and little cost to employers. Since 2010, PEO has invested close to \$500,000 to assist companies voluntarily complying with the repeal with their licensing costs, and had committed to offsetting almost half of the licensing fee of anyone required to be newly licensed as a result of the repeal. In addition, PEO had put in place a regulation to enable employers to transition over a one-year period.

Engineers are committed to public safety and are professionally accountable by law for all acts of professional engineering. The government's failure to repeal subsection 12(3)(a) leaves a gap in PEO's ability to regulate acts of engineering and continues to put workers at risk. This decision is a significant missed opportunity to protect the public and PEO demands the government reconsider it immediately.

Continuing Professional Development

PEO Council approves basics of continuing professional development program, directs further work before member referendum.

On November 20th, 2015, PEO Council was presented with a concept for a PEO continuing professional development (CPD) program in the Final Report of the Task Force on Continuing Professional Development, Competence and Quality Assurance (CPDCQA). After considerable discussion and in a recorded vote of 17 in favour, three against, with two abstentions, Council approved the program's guiding principles and basic elements, as outlined in the Proposed Implementation section of the task force's report.

Council also directed Registrar Gerard McDonald, P.Eng., to create terms of reference for a Continuing Professional Development Program (CPDP) Task Force, comprising eight PEO members, the majority of whom would be sitting PEO Councilors. The new task force would be responsible for finalizing the program's risk review form, continuing professional development requirement algorithm and criteria for acceptable technical activities. The task force terms of reference are to be presented to Council for approval at its February 2016 meeting.

In addition, Council directed the Registrar to develop a communications plan to notify PEO license holders and other stakeholders about the proposed continuing professional development and quality assurance program. This plan is also to be presented to Council for approval at its February 2016 meeting.

The CPDCQA Task Force was created in March 2014 and tasked with presenting a report describing a recommended CPD program to Council no later than December 2016. The task force met 12 times, conducted extensive research on issues related CPD, and provided two updates to Council. It also conducted an online survey of members (6,786 responses), and presented its proposed program at six regional town

hall meetings (514 attending), Regional Councillors Committee meetings, chapter meetings and other events. Member opinions were also solicited and received through a dedicated email address. This feedback from members was used to develop the proposed CPD program.

At its' September 25th, 2015 meeting, Council committed to asking members "to ratify in a referendum any mandatory requirement to participate in a continuing professional development, competency and quality assurance program". It is anticipated that such a referendum might occur late in 2016 or in 2017.
