The successful candidates will receive their scholarship by e-Transfer in the Fall upon proof of registration at Lakehead University.

To ensure a timely response to any questions, please submit your questions a minimum of 72 hours prior to the application deadline.

Lakehead Chapter PEO reserves the right of select criteria to select the awardee(s) based on the merits of submissions received by the deadline.

Submit your application in the form of a report (DOC or PDF file) using the identified headings to answer the following questions:

- 1) **Contact Information:** name, mailing address, email address, phone number, and name of your high school. Include the name of a Student Services contact for verification if necessary.
- 2) A statement confirming that you will attend the Faculty of Engineering at Lakehead University this Fall if accepted, and that all information provided in your submission is correct. If you later decide to attend a different university than Lakehead any award is forfeited.
- 3) A PDF of your academic marks transcript (may be submitted as a separate attachment).
- 4) What do the words "Professional Engineer" mean to you? In 300 words or less, describe what engineers do for society, and their responsibilities to society.
- 5) Why do you want to become a Professional Engineer? In 300 words or less, describe what field of specialization you wish to study, why, and what you want to achieve with your education and career.
- 6) In 200 words or describe your extracurricular interests and activities and explain why you chose to be involved in these activities (volunteering, athletics, counselling, clubs, hobbies, etc.). Also mention if there is any engineering component in your activities such as robotics, or math club, etc.
